In 2022, we expanded our Birth to Three program, increasing the number of families impacted by over 10%. Additionally, the Children's Long-Term Support program increased by over 35%. This was a direct result of the growing needs in the community and our ability to provide high-quality services. BIRTH TO THREE SERVICES

They are twins right down to their big, bright eyes. Dalajah and her twin sister, Dalayah, are so similar, they even need different color bows in their hair so others can tell them apart.

Born over two months early, they spent time in the NICU to grow stronger, but their mother, Kendra, still understands they are playing catch up. "Dalajah is currently nine months old, but her adjusted age is seven months." As most parents of babies born prematurely understand, that is very common. But as the girls grew, the differences became more apparent. Dalayah started to roll around, but Dalajah did not.

Today, Kendra can see a difference in Dalajah after starting physical therapy at Curative's Birth to Three services. She is eagerly trying to crawl and is pulling herself up. Kendra credits part of it to Curative, but part to her twin sister. "I think she was getting tired of being left behind by Dalayah who was rolling and crawling around," explains Kendra. "She was like, 'Hey there, I have to catch on to this.'"

Dalajah was originally referred to Birth to Three services at Curative because of the muscle tone imbalance and tension in her body. "We have been working on decreasing the stiffness in her body that has been limiting her mobility and ability to explore, improving balance in her muscles for smooth and coordinated arm and leg movement patterns as she moves around and plays with toys," explains Jody Hahn, OT, Dalajah's therapist. "And we are working toward enhancing her central stability to promote vocalizations, which will help her ability to use her voice to express herself. Dalajah is progressing well with the support of her family and Birth to Three team."

Kendrich, Dalajah's father, describes how the therapist leaves them with exercises to work on each week. "The therapist teaches me the skills I need to assist Dalajah's growth, like the different ways I can stretch her muscles at home in order to help her advance to the next stage," explains Kendrich. "Right now, they come out once a week, so this way we can help her between therapy sessions," adds Kendra. "Then, by the time they come back we are ready to work on something else to continuously help her."

"It is helpful that the team is very informative on what the current goals are for Dalajah," explains Kendrich.

Now Dalajah can move her arms and legs more actively and sit up on her own. "I see a lot of positive things coming from Birth to Three right now," adds Kendra.

Kendra wants to encourage other parents with premature infants in therapy to not give up hope. "At the beginning it starts off rocky but towards the middle you can see a positive ending. It's important to know that all the time and effort is worth it. So, keep the faith... It takes a lot of patience."

"I appreciate all Curative has done," adds Kendra. "I see a success story coming for Dalajah."

WHAT DOES CURATIVE NEW BERLIN THERAPIES OFFER?

Curative New Berlin Therapies is a certified rehabilitation agency providing physical, occupational, speech/language, oral motor and aquatic therapy for people of all ages. It has long been the provider of choice with experts in all areas of child development including movement, speech and sensory processing.



When you ask Marilyn and Stephen what Curative has done for their son, Andrew, they eagerly respond: "They have given him his voice."

Andrew is four years old and has Angelman Syndrome. One distinct characteristic of this is that those with this condition are typically non-verbal. After struggling to get Andrew into speech therapy, the family found the answer they were looking for at Curative.

"The progress has been huge since he has been at Curative," explains Stephen.

"Andrew is very non-verbal, but that doesn't mean he can't communicate. At first, it was really hard because he was frustrated," Stephen continues. "Our speech therapists, Michelle and Alisha, were instrumental in helping us try a variety of Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) devices and eventually getting us the one we wanted for him. Getting that device and the communication help we have received was a big step in helping Andrew be less frustrated," adds Marilyn.

"A combination of Andrew's curious, social and playful personality and his family's dedication to attending speech and language therapy and implementing a home carryover program consistently has supported him in making great progress," explains Michelle. "He is now using a robust communication system that supports him sharing a wide variety of messages with communication partners throughout his day."

The therapists have given the family other ways of communicating as well. "We have a tool for eating that goes under the clear top of his tray that has four or five little pictures that he can point at to tell us what he wants more of and if he is done," adds Stephen.

Therapy is an event for the whole family. "Because we are so involved in his therapies," explains Marilyn, "we are able to pick up a lot of what they are doing and apply it at home." They have also included Andrew's older brother, Anthony, in some of his speech therapy. "We did video with Anthony just making sounds like 'Ba ba ba ba,'" adds Stephen. "And, those were some of the first sounds Andrew did because he had Anthony's video. It also helps that Marilyn has been so dedicated to being actively engaged."

Alisha has also helped with Andrew's Individualized Education Program (IEP) for school when he started K4 to ensure that it included the use of his AAC device. "She gave us specific wording and what to say to the people on his team to make sure that he has his voice all day," adds Marilyn.

"I thought it would be a slower process," explains Marilyn. "I think he is somewhat of a rare case with how much he has achieved but he also has some really involved advocates on his speech therapy team who have been fighting for him from day one. And, I think if they are willing to fight for my kid that hard, how hard are they fighting for all these other kids, too. I have really been impressed from day one with our speech therapists at Curative. I would absolutely recommend them to anybody."

Carter is just like most nine year olds. He loves being outside, going to the park, creating his own puppet shows and helping around the house. His mom, Mesha, will even catch him helping with the laundry.

One thing that distinguishes Carter from many other nine year olds is that when he was two, he was diagnosed with autism. Despite facing challenges, today he is thriving and enjoying his daily routines. "He has had access to some great schools, which has helped him grow tremendously," explains Mesha. "He even likes getting up for school and getting on the bus." But while life for Carter sounds familiar to many grade school parents, it had been a challenge for Mesha until she was connected to Curative's Children's Long-Term Support Services (CLTS) through Milwaukee County's waiver program.

The CLTS Program is designed to find the supports and services that fit the needs of children to ensure that they are able to live their best lives. Supports and services may include non-traditional therapies or community resources. "A combination of both has allowed Carter to grow, flourish and thrive within his natural supports at home and the overall community," shares Nada Ivanic, Carter's service coordinator. Making this connection has been important to Carter's mom as well.

"It's been a life-changing experience. I don't feel like I'm doing this by myself anymore," explains Mesha. "Nada, our case worker at Curative, is a great resource as far as giving me information."

Curative has helped Mesha find activities that fit his needs during the summer, like a summer camp. "Finding this camp was wonderful for both Carter and me," adds Mesha. "It has been a challenge to keep him busy and active outside of school. And Curative has been a great resource."

Curative has also connected Mesha with respite care services. Her older son has been able to watch him. She found an individual at Carter's school who is able to provide respite services, as well. "I found someone who works with him on a daily basis who can come to my home. She takes him to the park and to different outings and activities," explains Mesha. "When I have to travel she comes to be here with him. It has been such a tremendous relief. His brother also helps with his daily routine."

"The Children's Long-term Support Waiver program will continue to be there for Carter many years to come. I have enjoyed seeing Carter's growth and look forward to many more milestones and accomplishments," adds Nada.

Mesha takes great comfort in knowing these services at Curative are here for her now and in the future. Her advice to other moms with autistic children is, "Don't give up, there are resources out there that will help make life just a little more manageable."

ADULT DAY SERVICES

WHAT DOES ADULT DAY SERVICES OFFER?

Adult Day Services provides programming at community-based sites in Milwaukee and Waukesha Counties. Programs offer a variety of purposeful, goal-oriented activities and opportunities that promote independence for adults with disabilities. The programs also provide daytime respite for caregivers.



Alea's aunt and grandfather appreciate that she has a place to go, like Club Curative, every day. Club Curative – part of Curative's Adult Day Services – is an innovative day program that provides a safe and supportive environment for adults age 18 to 29 with developmental disabilities. Alea has been going five days a week for over six years now, and her family couldn't be happier for her.

Club Curative gives Alea a purpose in life. She has a place to go where people are excited to see her. It provides her balance. "She hates to miss a day," explains Carl, Alea's grandfather. "When she is at home, she is just with two adults here. But at Club Curative, she has a lot of friends."

In addition, the staff help Alea focus on skills that will help her in life. "At first, our goal for her was to improve her speech," adds Wendy, Alea's aunt. "The staff found activities that matched her interests. For example, Alea loves to sing and dance so they had her in chorus for a while, and it helped with her annunciation of words."

Club Curative is also working with Alea on understanding the calendar, the weather and what season it is. "It comes heavily into play when she is picking clothes for the day and dressing herself. She is learning what is and isn't appropriate for the weather – based on what the calendar says versus what the weather says," adds Wendy. "Those types of things are important to us and they are things she is really making improvements on." Alea also enjoys the recreational activities like painting, doing puzzles, the Kinect bowling and watching movies.

"One of the things we really appreciate about Curative is when we have our quarterly meeting to go over her goals – the skills we need for her to focus on to improve her life – the staff really tries to incorporate them into lessons each quarter," says Wendy. "Money management is something that we want her to understand. They have really helped her with worksheets and practical experience to hands-on activities."

"We are so impressed that the program has adapted to fit Alea, instead of Alea needing to fit into the program," adds Carl. "All of the staff at this location are great to work with."

While Alea gets a lot out of her time at Club Curative, the staff also recognizes the wonderful attributes she brings each day. "Sunshine in human form" is the way the staff at Club Curative describes Alea. "She is one of the most positive, sweet, fun, loving individuals you will ever meet," adds Laura, a supervisor at Club Curative. "With her bright personality, we have seen friendships and socialization increase in our Club Curative program. At times, she will even assist other clients with miscellaneous tasks. The clients seem to appreciate her acts of kindness. Overall, the staff and clients are happy to have her a part of our day program!"

Siddiq takes his job at Curative Commercial Services very seriously. "Having this job means I have to be focused," explains Siddiq. "I come prepared. I'm ready. I'm focused. And, I'm all set to go." It is this positive attitude that makes him a valued employee.

Siddiq has been working at Curative for three years. He heard about Curative through the transitional youth program at Wauwatosa East High School. "He works in our assembly area on a multitude of handwork assemblies," explains Travis Kunz, one of his supervisors. "Since he joined us, we have placed him on numerous jobs in which he has excelled. His communication and interaction with coworkers have increased dramatically since we first met him."

Siddiq's mother, Keltoum, has noticed the same thing.

"I have seen a lot of growth in Siddiq since he started at Curative. He can communicate more, he talks more. He can give his opinion."

"I have always worked at the assembly side. I like the equipment they have there and the parts that they have. And, I am comfortable to do the work there," adds Siddiq. He appreciates that he was provided the training he needed to make him comfortable.

Keltoum is also pleased he is at Curative Commercial Services. "The staff is very professional and very nice. I am always in communication with Siddiq's supervisors, Travis and Jennifer. It's a very nice place and a safe place. I feel safe with my son being there," explains Keltoum. "They communicate with me before making any changes to Siddiq's schedule. For example, they wanted to try Siddiq on landscaping and I told them that I didn't think he would like that. They didn't fight me on that and they agreed with my opinion."

His mother can see that Siddiq enjoys his work at Curative. "He actually likes to go to work. He really enjoys it," shares Keltoum. "We had a vacation scheduled and we had to convince him that sometimes you have to take vacation and go."

Outside of work, Siddiq enjoys going to restaurants. He also likes to go grocery shopping. And, yes, when his parents can talk him into taking some time off, Siddiq enjoys going on vacation. "I have fun on vacation," adds Siddiq. "I like the water park. Once, we went to Noah's Ark. That's my favorite."

Keltoum is glad Curative has this program. "It has helped Siddiq a lot," adds Keltoum. "I no longer worry about him not having a job. He can live a typical life like other people."

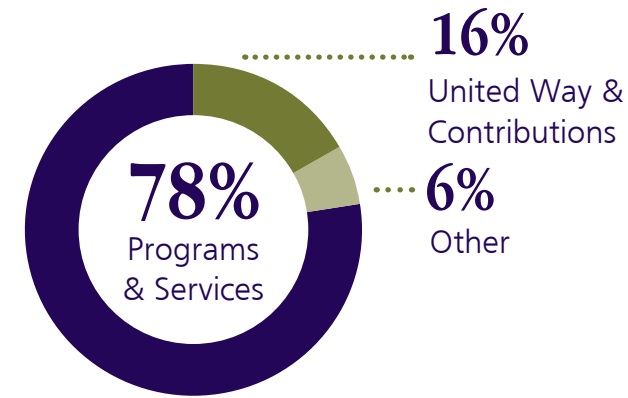

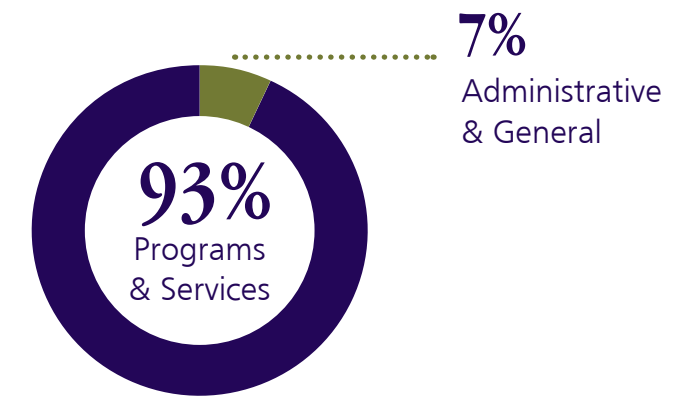
